- c) Destruction of high conservation values in forestry operations;
- d) Significant conversion of forest to plantation or non-forest use;
- e) Introduction of genetically modified organisms in forestry operations;
- f) Violation of any of the ILO Core Conventions as defined in the ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work.
